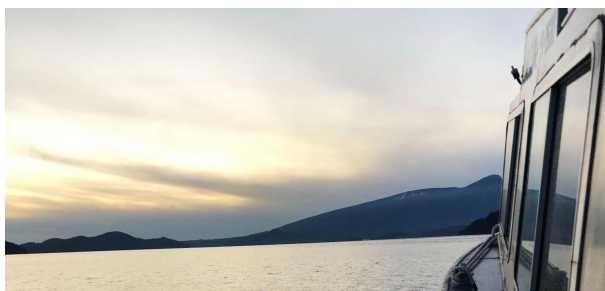


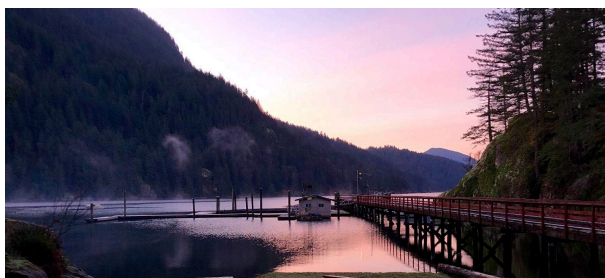
Camp Artaban Summer Information Package

What to expect

- Fun! Fun! Fun!
- Flexibility in your day
- Getting to Camp: this will involve a short water taxi ride from Horseshoe Bay Government Wharf or Sunset Marina (current public health restrictions will apply).
- The cost of the water taxi is included in your registration fee.
 - Pay parking is available at Horseshoe Bay and the marina
 - This boat ride will be an opportunity to see whales, seabirds, and beautiful Howe Sound from the water. If you plan to bring your own boat to camp, please contact the Camp office.
 - Our Camp staff will greet you upon your arrival at Camp and provide you with more information for your stay.
- Arrival at camp will be late in the afternoon or early evening. Departure will be early afternoon.
- Choose your adventure each day: hiking, swimming, relaxing in nature, volleyball, beach exploration, forest exploration and relaxing at your leisure are some options available to you. You should let us know, for safety reasons, if you are going hiking or exploring.
- There will be opportunities to sign up for designated times for your group to use our recreation hall, sports areas, and waterfront.
- Our staff is here to help you enjoy your stay, so ask them questions and for directions to help you get the most out of your visit. We will endeavor to make your stay fun and comfortable.
- There will be sign up times to use certain areas of the camp such as the showers in order to keep all our guests safe and allow our staff time to clean these areas.
- Just wait until you see all the stars! Camp relies on a generator for power. When the generator goes off at night, there will be no power anywhere in Camp. The flush toilet building will not be available at night. However, the outhouse building (Port) will be accessible.
- We love our pets too, but please leave your furry friends at home as they are not allowed at Camp.
- Our Canteen will be available for purchases of Camp souvenirs and clothing as well as candy, drinks and snacks and small personal items.

COVID-19 Policies & Protocols

What to Bring:

Your gear

- Personal clothing and footwear for the outdoors, planning for sunshine, rain and cool nights.
- Closed-toe shoes for around Camp as terrain can be uneven. Footwear for waterfront activities.
- Bedding. Mattresses will be provided in the cabin bunks. We suggest you bring a sleeping bag and pillow.
- Keep in mind that you will have to load your own luggage on and off the water taxi.
- Personal care items including sunscreen and bug repellent.
- Personal face masks (2 or 3 per person), hand sanitizer; optional: face shield, tissues, gloves.

- Portable charger for your phone.
- Flashlight or headlamp.

Personal Food and Beverages

- Families are welcome to bring snacks in airtight plastic containers to keep in your accommodation.
- There will be a tote bin in your cabin to protect any food that comes into your cabin.
- We are a nut-aware camp. Please do not bring any food containing nuts to camp
- Alcohol consumption policy is in effect at all times at camp. Read it [here](#).
 - Please ensure your bottles and cans return home with you.

➤ Sample menu

Breakfast

- Bacon, Eggs, Hash Browns (cubed potatoes) Seasonal fruits, Assorted cereal and oatmeal with asst. Toppings.
- Coffee and tea, fruit juice

Lunch

- Grilled Cheese sandwiches with tomato soup
- Veggies with ranch dip (sliced cucumber, carrot sticks, celery sticks, cherry tomatoes)
- Lemonade or iced tea

Dinner

- Chili with cornbread and butter
- Salad (tossed green or caesar)
- Lemonade or iced tea

Dessert

- Cupcakes (chocolate or vanilla) with icing or s'mores

Extra snacks and drinks are available in our canteen during the posted hours.

➤ Special Diets (restrictions & preferences)

- Vegetarian options will be available. Please note on your registration form if you will require this option.
- We are a nut-aware camp. Please notify us if you have a severe allergy and carry an Epi-pen.

- [Contact the Camp office](#) via phone or email if you would like to discuss your dietary needs further. For vegan and gluten-free diets, there will be an extra charge.



Standard of Conduct for Visitors

- Campers should be self-monitoring for any signs of illness, including COVID-19. Any illness should be reported to the Onsite Director.
- Campers agree to abide by the procedures Camp Artaban has implemented to adhere to the BC Camping Association Guidelines for overnight camps in compliance with the Public Health Orders.
- The wearing of non-medical face masks on the water taxi and in shared indoor spaces may be required..
- Campers may be expected to only socialize within their family unit or the group they came to camp with.
- Supervision of children is solely the parent's responsibility. This includes hiking and waterfront time.
- Campfires will be in designated campfire sites only and will be lit and monitored by the camp staff.
 - All campfires must be extinguished by 10:00pm
 - No fires will be permitted if there is a Provincial fire ban.
- Camp quiet hours are 10:00pm to 8:00am and campers are expected to abide by them.
- Alcohol and drug use policies are in effect. [Read them here.](#)
 - Alcohol consumption at your campsite only, in moderation and for persons 19 years of age and older.
 - Smoking permitted only in the designated area.
 - Failure to comply with these policies could result in campers being asked to leave camp at their own expense
- Be kind and respectful to each other and to the staff so that we can all enjoy Camp this summer.

- Be on time for your assigned activities and meal times so all our guests can enjoy the same opportunities during their scheduled times
- If mandated, use only your group's assigned dining and bathroom areas, respecting the health and safety of other guests.
- Keep your campsite, whether a tent pad or cabin, clean and tidy.
 - Before you leave, please sweep your cabin and put all garbage and recycling in the appropriate bins. Please take your empty bottles and cans home with you.
- Any willful damage or vandalism to your accommodation or other areas of the camp will result in an extra financial charge of \$200 in addition to your rental cost
- Minimize your impact on the environment by leaving nature in its place and minimizing the waste you produce during your stay.
- Registering for a Camp rental confirms you and your group have read and agree to abide by the expectations of this Standard of Conduct for Visitors at Camp Artaban.
